9th biennial juried show for Massachusetts clay artists

An additional two invitational shows that were held at the Fuller Craft Museum in 2006 and 2015. The show will also be featured in the Freedom's Way National Heritage area and the National Park Service.

Presented by the Lexington Arts and Crafts Society, State of Clay is the only juried show in Massachusetts that showcases works by clay artists who come from all over the state. Works are also featured by former residents who reside elsewhere in the U.S.

This year's exhibition features a wide variety of works selected by Juror, Wayne Higby, professor at the NY State College of Ceramics at Alfred University and director & curator of the new Joseph-Schein Museum in Alfred University and whose ceramics are in numerous art museums around the world including the Met in NY and the Victoria and Albert Museum in London.

Reception and Juror Talk with extended hours on Friday, May 20 with Prof. Higby, our guest speaker, from 6 to 9pm and then will personally award prizes of pieces he considers to be the most outstanding.

Besides showcasing the artists and their work, the show educates the public about the vitality and growth of ceramic art within Massachusetts.
