9th biennial juried show for Massachusetts clay artists

Presented by the Lexington Arts and Crafts Society, the State of Clay is the only juried show in Massachusetts that showcases work by ceramicists with ties to the state.

This year's exhibition was juried by Wayne Higby, professor at the New York State College of Ceramics at Alfred University and director/curator of the Joseph-Schein Museum at Alfred University. His work is in numerous museums including the Met in New York and the Victoria and Albert Museum in London.

Besides showcasing the artists and their work, the show educates the public about the vitality and growth of ceramic art within the state of Massachusetts.
