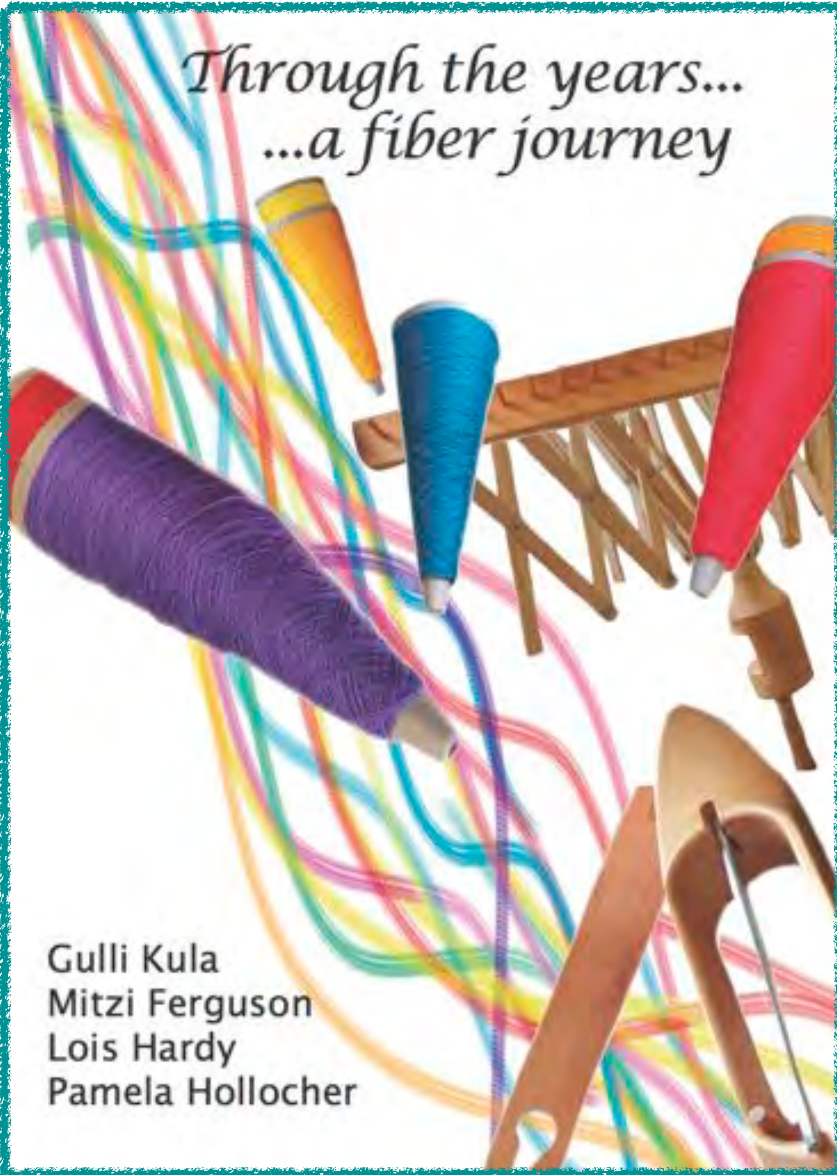

"Through the Years...a fiber journey", features the weaving of four long time members of the Lexington Weavers' Guild: Gulli Kula, Lois Hardy, Pam Hollocher and Mitzi Ferguson. All inspirations to other fiber artists because of their talent, creativity, skill and generosity.

- **Gulli Kula**, a master weaver, wove several pieces that reflected various stages of her life.
- **Lois Hardy's** dolls are well-known and collected by several people in New England.
- **Pam Hollocher** is a weaver who has woven projects in many techniques. One of her special efforts was to weave an overshoot coverlet for all of her 6 granddaughters.
- **Mitzi Ferguson** is an expert weaver who focused on and mastered the overshoot technique in her long weaving career.
- Other Guild members will display projects woven with yarns from the mill of our featured speaker, Chick Colony, Harrisville Designs, in Harrisville, NH.

- Woolen yarn has been spun in the water powered, brick mill town of Harrisville since 1794. This small village is nestled in the Monadnock Highlands of southwestern New Hampshire and is the only industrial community of the early 19th Century that still survives in America in its original form.
- In 1977, the Department of Interior designated Harrisville a National Historic Landmark.
- Harrisville Designs is still owned and operated by John and Patricia Colony. They have been joined by two of their three sons, Timothy and Nicholas, who are interested in carrying on the textile tradition that's been part of their family for generations. "There is a great tradition of textiles in our community and in our culture and we are pleased to share that tradition of quality with our customers." - *John Colony*
